#### **Government lays Immigration Rules introducing increased MIR**

Dear Friends,

On the 14th of March the government laid in Parliament <u>the Statement of Changes to</u> <u>the Immigration Rules</u> that will introduces changes to the Minimum Income Requirement (MIR) for **applications made from the 11th of April 2024**.

The changes introduce include:

- Increase to the MIR to £29,000
- Amount of savings increased to £88,500 (amount of the new MIR x 2.5 + £16,000) (£29,000 x 2.5 + £16,000 = 88,500)
- There won't be a separate child element as before so if the person is able to meet the 29,000 threshold they will also be able to sponsor children to come to the UK without requiring an additional amount for children as before.

#### Important to note:

Compared with before people under the Appendix Armed Forces have now a different MIR and rules with people under the Appendix FM.

These are the key changes:

• This will similarly no longer include an additional income requirement for children.

As with the main income rule, people generally need to have had the required amount of savings in their account(s) for six months before applying.

Here are the links of the three key documents published:

Here below is a reminder of the **transitional arrangements**:

• Those who already have a family visa within the five-year partner route, or who apply before the minimum income threshold is raised, will continue to have their applications assessed against the current income requirement and will not be required to meet the increased threshold. This will also be the case for children seeking to join or accompany parents.

• Anyone granted a fiancé visa before the minimum income threshold is raised will also be assessed against the current income requirement when they apply for a family visa within the five-year partner route.

• Those already in the UK on a different route who apply to switch into the fiveyear partner route, after the minimum income requirement has been increased, will be subject to the new income requirement.

### **Pledge for Families**

Families are the bedrock of our society.

Yet, in the last few months the UK's migration policies regarding bi-national families have been made extremely worse and prohibitively more expensive.

There is clear evidence, including from the recent initial findings report published by Reunite Families UK, that these policies have a hugely detrimental impact on the mental health of people caught up in the system, including the lengthy, complex and expensive routes to permanent settlement and the Minimum Income Requirement for British/settled citizens to be reunited with their loved ones.

That is why I pledge to support immigration policies that help reunite families and reduce the financial burden associated with the routes to settlement.

A first step in this has to be a full root and branch review of our family immigration system and the way it affects the mental health of people going through the UK immigration system.

By doing so I will also help alleviate the mental health crisis affecting tens of thousands of people and their communities as a result of the #HostileRoutes and policies introduced in the last decade.





# Joint Evidence on the Statement of Changes introducing the increased MIR



Reunite Families UK together with the <u>The Immigration Law Practitioners' Association</u> (ILPA) have prepared Joint Evidence on the Secondary Legislation that will bring in the new increased Minimum Income Requirement as well as introducing other changes to the rules.

The evidence, which have been endorsed by the <u>Joint Council for the Welfare of</u> <u>Immigrants</u>, <u>Migrant Voice</u>, <u>Praxis</u> and <u>British in Europe</u> highlights various shortfall
